A collaboration between the Singapore International Foundation (SIF) and the British Council (BC), the SIF-BC Artist-in-Residence Exchange programme provides artists an opportunity to work and live in leading art cities, share and gain new perspectives, grow their professional and personal networks, and collaborate on new art works with foreign artists. In 2013/2014, the programme culminated with Singaporean artist-architect Randy Chan and British artist Philippa Lawrence collaborating on the site-specific installation Angles of Incidence that reflected their response to the heritage and nature in both countries, creating space for contemplation about community, heritage and memory.

Angles of Incidence comprises a multi-faceted pod and its family of reflective offshoots, that were strewn beneath the Singapore Botanic Gardens' 80-year old Kapok tree, and subsequently 19th Century Plane trees at the Inner Temple Gardens in London. Visitors were able to experience the oscillation between the installation and nature as the reflective installation merges into and emerges from the landscape.

Following the installation at the Gardens, Angles of Incidence was exhibited in London at the Inner Temple Gardens. Thereafter returning to Singapore where it was featured as part of the Singapore Night Festival. The installation is currently on display as part of SIF's annual arts showcase, DiverseCity, at the National Museum of Singapore until 28 Feb 2015.
