

ANGLES OF INCIDENCE

Blink, and you might miss the site-specific installation sitting below an 80-year-old kapok tree at the Singapore Botanic Gardens.

The steel sculptures are subtle, camouflaged by their reflective surfaces which mirror the surrounding greenery. Crystal elements that adorn the sculptures, however, bring attention to the work of art born of a collaboration between Singapore artist-architect Randy Chan and British artist Philippa Lawrence. The artistic partnership is forged through the Singapore International Foundation and British Council's third Artist-in-Residence Exchange programme, which promotes cross-cultural interaction and understanding.

The installation is on display until Sunday, when it is moved to London for an exhibition. Visitors can share their photographs of the installation via Instagram using the tag #SIFBCAIRx, as well as enter them for an online photo competition at airx.sg. Three entries will receive prizes and the closing date is March 28.
