





WHAT

Every city in the world owns up to its very own musical language and here comes Musicity to provide the platform on which that sonic fabric may properly unravel. This global initiative has already taken over the music capital that is London to not just pinpoint its finest talents, but to also push those artists into exploring and rediscovering its city musically, architecturally and experientially. To hit those multisensory marks, local musicians are commissioned to compose original music inspired by iconic landmarks, as well as to collaborate with special guests in a creative and musical exchange of minds.



All that sonic alchemy continues to make Musicity's 2012 program, which helmed by the British Council for the very first time, will be taking a stand in Singapore. A total of seven local musicians have been assembled and assigned to different locations – the keys to the city, if you will – each boasting enough historic and artistic value to serve as inspiration for their respective musical pieces.

Such a union of iconic architecture and our own flag-bearing band of musicians is bound to make for some great conversations - the best way to, in Musicity mastermind DJ Nick Luscombe's words, "plug into the diverse and thriving cityscape".


