Visa Processing Times

UKVI is prioritising Ukraine Family Scheme applications in response to the humanitarian crisis caused by the invasion of Ukraine, and so applications for study, work and family visas may take longer to process.

'Priority' and 'super priority' visa services have been temporarily suspended for new study, work and family visa applications.

Standard visitor visas are currently taking an average of 6 weeks to process.

UKVI apologise for any inconvenience caused.

You will be contacted by the visa application centre when your passport is ready for collection. Do not attend the visa application centre until you have been invited to do so.

Visa Options for Students:

Standard Visitor Visa (courses less than 6 months)

Short-term study Visa (courses 6 to 11 months)

Student Visa (with a Student route sponsor)



Student Visa

You can apply if 16 or over and have been offered a place on a course by a licensed student sponsor.

Eligibility

- If you're 16 or over
- Have been offered a place on a course by a licensed student sponsor
- Have enough money to support yourself and pay for your course
- Have an appropriate level of English for your course
- Have consent from your parents if under 18

Staying longer in the UK:

- Extend your visa if eligible to continue your studies
- Switch to a Student Visa from another visa category
- Switch to a Graduate Visa after completing your course

When to apply

- Outside the UK earliest is 6 months before you start your course
- Inside the UK earliest is 3 months before your course starts

How long it takes to get a decision

 You will usually get a decision on your visa within 3 weeks of online application

Student Visa

What you can do:

- Study
- Work as a student union sabbatical officer
- You may be able to bring dependents with you (partner and children)

What you cannot do:

- Claim public funds
- Work in certain jobs (ex: professional sportsperson/coach)
- Be self-employed
- Study at an academy or a local authority-funded school

When you can travel to the UK

- You can arrive before your course starts, either:
 - Up to 1 week before courses 6 months or less
 - Up to 1 month before courses more than 6 months

Fees:

- £363 to apply for a Student visa from outside the UK
- £490 to extend or switch to a student visa

Dependents

Your partner and children may be able to apply to come to the UK or stay longer in the UK.

The student must be one of the following:

- A full time student on a postgraduate level course (RQF level 7 or above) that lasts 9 months or longer
- A new government-sponsored student on a course that lasts longer than 6 months
- A Doctorate Extension Scheme student

Your relationship:

- Your husband, wife or civil partner
- Your unmarried partner
- Your child under 18 years old

Documents dependents will need:

- Financial support
- Marriage Certificate, Family Register certificates, evidence of co-habitation
- Birth Certificate for children
- IHS reference number

How long dependents can stay

If their application is successful, their visa will end on the same date as yours.

Common Reasons for Refusal

- Not including the correct supporting documents or submitting documents without translations
- Failing to disclose full travel or immigration history
- Not providing evidence of the relationship between you and your parents/guardian or sponsor
- Forgetting to get a Tuberculosis or ATAS certificate

International Travel Guidance

18 March travel to England changes

If you will arrive in England from abroad after 4am, Friday 18 March, you do not need to:

- take any COVID-19 tests before you travel or after you arrive
- fill in a UK passenger locator form before you travel

This will apply whether you are vaccinated or not.

You also will not need to quarantine when you arrive, in line with current rules.

Other countries still have COVID-19 entry rules in place. You should check travel advice before you travel.

If you will arrive in England before 4am, 18 March, you must follow the current rules as set out in this guidance.
