- You can obtain the STEP application form by:

 - Requesting the form by email. A copy of applicant's IC or passport is required when submitting the form
- You can register for STEP exam in person at the British Council (Singapore) Limited, 30 Napier Road, Singapore 258509.
- First registration for STEP closes on 27 April 2020
- Late registration closes on 04 May 2020 . A late registration fee is applicable to all entries after the first registration closing date
- Full payment must be made upon registration. You can pay by cash, NETS or credit cards (Master/Visa)

EXAM CONFIRMATION

- The British Council will email you a STEP candidate number within three working days of registration
- We will email you a letter about examination date, time and venue two to three weeks before the exam date.

DAY OF THE EXAM

- Candidates are to arrive 30 minutes before the start of the exam
- Candidates must bring the same NRIC or passport which was used at the point of exam registration. Identity card without photograph is not acceptable.
- Candidates must bring along the necessary stationery in a CLEAR pencil case to the examination room (stationery will not be provided)
Note: Books, dictionaries, calculators, mobile phone and rough papers are not allowed.

NOTIFICATION OF THE RESULTS

- UK STEP examination centre will notify the relevant universities of the test results by 13 August 2020.
- Paper results are no longer issued for STEP. All results will be released via Cambridge Assessment Results Online System.

Introduction

Sixth Term Exam Paper (STEP) is a well-established Mathematics university admissions test, which is used to help to select very academically able students for courses which are usually oversubscribed.

Who needs to take STEP?

Candidates who have received offers for Mathematics courses at the University of Cambridge will normally be required to sit STEP as a post-interview test. The University of Warwick also includes STEP in its undergraduate Mathematics offers; the University of Bristol, the University of Oxford and Imperial College London all encourage applicants to take the papers.

Candidates should ask the universities they have received offers from in order to find out which papers they need to sit. Typically, the universities will specify which papers a candidate needs to sit in their offer letter.

How is STEP structured?

The test consists of up to three **3-hour paper-based examinations: STEP 1, STEP 2 and STEP 3**. Candidates are usually required to sit either one or two of the examinations, depending on the requirements of the universities they have applied to.

A lined answer booklet is provided for each paper. Graph paper is not provided, as the test requires only sketches, not detailed graphs. **There is no longer a formulae booklet for STEP Mathematics examinations.**

Calculators are not permitted (or required) for STEP.

How do I register for STEP?

The application forms are available at the Customer Services Counter or you can download them from our website <https://www.britishcouncil.sg/exam/professional-university/admission-tests>. Please register in person at the Customer Services Counter.

To register in person

You must complete the application form and full payment must be made upon registration. You can pay by cash, NETS or credit card (Master/Visa).

Refund
